Grave Location.

1. Replying to your letter of September 7th, I sincerely regret that a clerical inadvertence should have caused you to receive notification that the burial place of your husband was incomplete, the name of the Belgian city being given but not the place where the same is located.

2. The numbers as given you formerly are correct, and the cemetery is located in Poperinghe, Belgium.

3. This is one of our two concentration cemeteries in Belgium and is side by side with a large British Military Cemetery at that place, our troops having been associated with the British in the campaign which their sacrifice has made historic.

4. I beg to give you every assurance of my sympathy, and am ready to serve you in any way.
