EXTRACT FROM ARMY REGULATIONS.

"162½. The following reports are required by the War Department in the
 case of the death of a soldier in the active service:

(a) Report of death and disposal of remains (Form No. 415, A. G. O.) to be
 made by the commanding officer of the post or station or of a command in the
 field, and forwarded directly to The Adjutant General of the Army as soon as
 practicable after final disposition has been made of the remains."
