We have an order for a bronze tablet from the family of Private Ralph R. Johncox who was killed September 29th, 1918 in France or Belgium.

He was a member of <u>Company A, 108th Regiment</u>, Infantry, U. S. A. and died from wounds received in action in the breaking of the Hindenburg line. His mother, Mrs. Johncox, is very anxious to have the exact place of death placed in the inscription on the tablet. We have made every effort to secure this data for Mrs. Johncox and Col. Edgar S. Jennings of the regiment states that the records were turned over to the War Department and suggests our writing this letter.

We would greatly appreciate it if you would kindly try and locate the exact place of death of Private Johncox and if you could secure same to-morrow (Wednesday) or Thursday, we will ask you to kindly telegraph us this information at our Buffalo Office, 858-860 Main Street.

It will not be necessary to telegraph us unless you can give us the name of the town or city in which Private Johncox died and also the country in which this particular city is located, either France or Belgium.
