His mother understands that the bodies of those buried at Rouen are to be moved to some other burial plot, and is considerably worried over the fact.

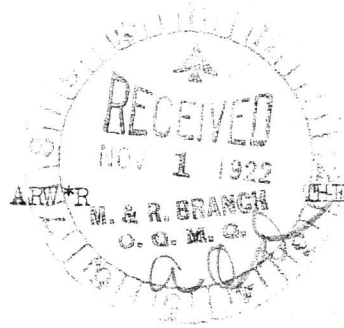
