- 1. Replying to your letter of April 7, 1919 which has been forwarded from "rance, and only recently received in this office, I beg to state that the body of your son, Private Clarence E. Lear, Co. B., 509th Infantry, has been reburied in our large concentration cometery known as the Argenne American Cemetery at Romagne-Sous-Mont-faucon, Department of the Meuse: Grave 93, Section 28, Plot 2.
- 2. The final disposition of the bodies of the dead members of the American Expeditionary Forces interred in France, has not yet been made the subject of definite orders on the part of higher military authority, and this office has no jurisdiction in the matter of deciding upon their return.
