INSTRUCTIONS.

Two of this form are fastened in each record. When a man is enrolled both forms will be executed: one removed from the service record and filed with the shipping articles, the other to remain in the record.

This form must be sworn to before an officer of the United States Navy or Marine Corps authorized to administer oaths, or before a notary public.

The full names and addresses of the beneficiaries should be carefully stated. If a married woman, her own Christian name should be given, not that of her husband: thus, "Mrs. Anna May Smith," not "Mrs. John Smith."

New beneficiary slips should be filled out and forwarded to the Commandant of the Naval District to which the man is attached in all cases in which such action becomes necessary by reason of change in the status of the officer or man, or of his beneficiaries, due, for example, to marriage, death, birth of children, or the fact that a designated beneficiary should cease to be dependent. In any event the payment will be made to the widow or children, if any, of the officer or enlisted man, whether designated or not.
