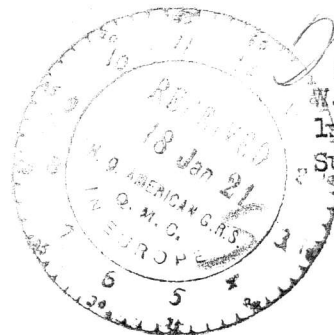
1. Returned. In compliance with paragraph 5, basic communication, the body buried in grave #53, Section A, Plot 2, American Cemetery #617, FISMES, (Marne), was exhumed for identification, with the following results:

Body buried in uniform, wrapped in shelter half. No coffin. Machine gun bullet holes over both right and left eyes. Lower jaw missing. Collar ornament with crossed rifles, Company B, 59th Infantry; also "U.S." A medal ribbon was found with three stripes; center stripe red; two outer stripes yellow. Two ribs were found left side grown together.
