- 2. Act occurred on morning of 1st November, 1918, in Bois des Loges, west of Champignuelle.
 - 3. Next of Kin: Mrs. Carrie L. White, (Mother)

- 4. The circumstances of the act for which it is recommended that this award be made are as follows;

Private White, who was a runner, volunteered to carry a message to the Bois des Loges. In order to reach that place he had to cross a long stretch of open country that was under heavy machine gun and shell fire. He delivered his message successfully and was returning, when he was killed by a burst of machine gun fire. His constant devotion to duty and his willingness to serve were marked attributes of his character, and servedas an inspiration to his fellow runners.

5. I was in command of Company "B" at the time of above stated act and have personal knowledge of same.
